Community Consultative Committee Details

1. Executive Summary

The Bringelly Brickworks CCC was established prior to PGH relinquishing its current long-standing planning approval for a new approval.

This report covers the period January to December 2019.

The committee met once (in September) in the period January to December 19. Committee members were consulted on the need for meetings while approval had still not been triggered during the repoiting period and agreed that the reduced frequency was acceptable in 2019.

The meeting focused on road condition and road works, the status of the approval, management plans (particularly the transport management plan given the traffic volume near the Bringelly School) environmental performance (dust monitoring) and the previous annual report. The Committee also discussed the neighbouring concrete batching plant approval proposed by Boral.

2. CCC activities over last 12 months

- One meeting held on 26 September 2019
- There was a majority of members present.
- Additional consultation activities related to the CCC have included correspondence with CCC members outside meetings.

- CCC will continue to follow up invitation to RMS to present on the upgrades the intersection of the Northern Rd and Greendale Rd and seek resolutions to safety.
